Paris Climate Agreement: Signing and the Way Forward

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Climate - Survival Issue

- We humans are causing global warming
- We are seeing bad impacts NOW
- Impacts FAR WORSE if we do not act (BAU)
- No place to hide under BAU
- Disasters worse due to Climate Change: Increased conflict (wars/national insecurity), water shortages, crop failures, intense fires, droughts, flooding, species extermination, disease increase, extreme weather, sea level rise, heat waves, precipitation changed, AND economic/finance disruption (breakdown) ...

Climate is a Justice / Ethics Issue

- Climate Justice:
 - Poor have the smallest effect on climate hurt the worst
- Intergenerational Ethics: Our descendants
 - More humane and cheaper for preventive action now rather than disaster adaptive action by our descendants in the future

Sustainable Development Goals – All are tied to Climate Change #13



We CAN mitigate Climate Change

- Recognize/acknowledge problem extent
- Climate Change Risk Management
 - Long term solution vs. short term expediency
 - Need Change: All Deliberate Speed to renewables
 - Obstacles: Disinformation / Political Obstruction, Economic issues, Psychological...
- Action: All levels from local to global needed
 - No "silver bullet" solution exists
 - Individuals, NGOs, business, cities, governments
 - International climate agreement Paris 2015 =>


2015 Paris Climate Change Conference




(Intended) Nationally Determined Contributions INDCs at Paris

- INDCs VOLUNTARY, not top down
 - Emissions reductions by each country
 - All countries now have INDCs
- US INDC: Cut emissions by 26-28% below 2005 levels by 2025
 - Also China, Europe, Brazil, South Africa ...
 - India more coal, more solar

Paris INDCs if fulfilled gives +3.5°C by 2100, better than BAU, still much too hot



Emissions +2°: developing countries must peak, decrease (leapfrog)



Bottom Line: What did Paris deliver?

- Solid Agreement. Better than expected.
- All countries compromised
- Goal keep below +2 degrees C (+1.5°C)
- BUT: NOT enough for +2°C target
- Need future stronger INDCs

Paris Agreement II

- Measurement, Reporting, Verification
- Review every 5 years, increase "ambition"
- Green fund to developing countries
 - \$100B/yr or more by 2020 from developed countries
- Loss and damage some language
- Hybrid legal structure complicated
 - Some parts binding, some not binding
 - Agreement is a new International treaty
 - BUT NOT a new national treaty for US
 - Implements existing UNFCCC treaty (1992)

U.S. + 170 other countries signed Paris Agreement on Earth Day 4/22



Next Step on Way Forward: Ratification

- U.S. Executive Order, Obama will sign
- China Plans to ratify by fall 2016
- All ahead of schedule
- Paris Climate Agreement becomes effective once [55+ countries ratify] with [55% + GHG emissions]


