H.E. Dr. Amrith Rohan Perera, Ambassador and Permanent Representative of the Permanent Mission of Sri Lanka to the United Nations in New York. Dr. Perera is a Graduate of Law of the University of Ceylon (1971). After being admitted as an Advocate of the Supreme Court (1973), he practiced in the field of Civil Law. He then joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as an Assistant Legal Advisor (1976). Thereafter, he was appointed as Additional Legal Advisor and finally Legal Advisor, in which capacity he served until his retirement from public service in 2007. Until 2011, Dr. Perera served a member of the International Law Commission (ILC), having been elected to the Commission in 2007. He also chairs the United Nations Ad-hoc Committee on Measures to Eliminate International Terrorism, currently negotiating the Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism. He has also served as a Visiting Lecturer in Public International Law at the Department of Law, University of Peradeniya, Open

University of Sri Lanka, Bandaranaike Centre for International Studies and the General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University. In May 2010, Dr. Perera was appointed as a Commissioner of the Lessons Learnt and Reconciliation Commission (LLRC).



Hon. Ms. Rachel Wambui Shebesh, Chief Administrative Secretary of the Ministry of Public Service, Youth and Gender Affairs of Kenya. Hon. Ms. Shebesh has been Chief Administrative Secretary since 2nd March, 2018. Born to an urban family in Nairobi, in the course of her growing up, education and early adult life, she encountered deep seated discrimination of women and youth in leadership and management of Kenya's affairs in all respects. Rachel's active leadership career began with the Vision Sisters, a grassroots women organization committed to the betterment of women lives. She is currently the patron of the group which originally operated in the slums of Korogocho but now has 23 groups all over Nairobi County and boasts of a strong membership of 2820. She belongs to the influential PLDP Alumni, The Pioneers for Change having been among the very first group of emerging young leaders to receive one year intensive training in 2005. The training was sponsored by the Fredrich Ebert Stiftung and coordinated by

the Youth Agenda and the 4Cs. The acts of discrimination and the subtle efforts to consign women and youth to the periphery of national affairs pushed her to political activism and party leadership. She was first nominated to Parliament in 2007 by the Orange Democratic Party (ODM) to represent the interests of persons with disabilities. Rachel became the Champion for the Kenya Disabilities Network (KDN).



Hon. Ms. Marjan Mateen, Deputy Minister of Education of Afghanistan. Hon. Ms. Mateen began working as Deputy Minister of Education in 2019. Prior to this, Ms. Mateen was the First Ladies' Advisor on Youth and Educational Affairs. In this role, Ms. Mateen focused on improving the quality of education in Afghanistan through standardizing the curriculum. Ms. Mateen was also a member of the High Council for Human Resources under the auspices of President Ashraf Ghani. It was in this capacity that Ms. Mateen began advocating for high quality and professional education curriculum. Ms. Mateen graduated from Zarghuna high School in Kabul and earned her undergraduate and postgraduate degree from the Jawaharlal Nehru University in India. Ms. Mateen has a bachelor of social sciences (political science, journalism and psychology) and has received her Master's Degree in International Relations.



Dr. Ida Betty Odinga, EGH is the Wife of the Former Prime Minister of Kenya, H.E. Mr. Raila Odinga and a Patron of the "Embrace Women Building Bridges for Kenya" Initiative. Dr. Odinga is an Icon in Kenya. Her life journey is synonymous with fighting for justice, advocating for the less fortunate, fighting for women's rights, as well as being a great mentor and influencer for women's leadership and a voice for the young girls of Kenya. A much-known face that is also celebrated for her grace, talent in leadership as well as intellect, she is a teacher by profession having taught for a period of over 20 years since she graduated from the University of Nairobi. Dr. Odinga is also celebrated as one the first women to head a major corporation when she took over as the Managing Director of East Africa Spectre in 2003. The wife of Kenya's Former Prime Minster, she has been a great influence in the journey that has made the Prime Minister's political career possible. Dr. Odinga is peace crusader and played a key role in the historic

"Handshake" in Kenya that saved the country after the difficult electioneering period in 2017. She has also just been named the Champion for Universal Health Care and adds to the numerous initiatives she has spearheaded in the past namely: Founder and Past Chairperson - League of Kenya women Voters; Patron - White Ribbon Alliance- Kenya that aims at preventing maternal deaths through initiating safe motherhood programs; Patron - Freedom from Fistula Foundation that aims at creating awareness of the causes, preventions and cure for those afflicted; Past Patron - Kenya Medical Women's Association; Patron - Kenya breast health organization; Champion - Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) and UNICEF nutrition Initiatives Champion - Integrated carepack program that aims at maximizing efforts in Kenya in the fields of Malaria, Diarrheal diseases and HIV; Chairperson - Paraplegic Association of Kenya Advisory Board.
