

What is the UN MGCY?

The <u>official and self-organised space for children and youth</u> in certain intergovernmental and allied process <u>at the United Nations.</u>

Vision of the UN MGCY

Children and youth are planning, designing, implementing, monitoring, reviewing and evaluating sustainable development policies.

What gives UN MGCY the mandate?

Agenda 21; UN General Assembly Resolutions (such as 2013's A/Res/67/290); Agreements with UN bodies and conferences



Who are the Members?

Any individual 30 years old or under who signs up to the MGCY online or in person.

Any <u>organisation</u>, <u>network</u>, <u>committee</u>, <u>group or other association of individuals</u> that signs up to the MGCY online or in person and that fulfills either of the following requirements:

- Representative of the interests of children and/or youth, and has a policymaking body controlled by people 30 years old or under;
- Works with children and/or youth but doesn't have a policymaking body controlled by individuals 30 years old or under.



The Governance Structure of The UN MGCY

UN MGCY consists of Internal & External **Working Groups.**

Working Groups are coordinated by 1-3 facilitators and open for any member to be involved.

The decision-making space of UN MGCY is monthly assembly calls.

The overarching facilitators of all the working groups, the assembly calls and administration are the Organising Partners.

Organising Partners (OPs)

Mandated Tasks

- . Facilitation. Governance and Outreach:

- . The OPs are elected by the UN MGCY participants, through online voting.
- Each elected organisation have a 2 years mandate.
- Extract of criteria for eligible organisation; none-profitable, works with young people and has a decision-making body controlled by children and/or young people.

Board & Legal Entity

(Children and Youth International)

Children and Youth International are the board and the legal entity of the UN MGCY. All MGCY participants are members of Children and Youth Internation

Mandated Tasks

- Operates the Finance Working Group;
- . Co-ordinates the Elections / Selection IWG.

- The board members of C&Y I are elected in a staggered manner MGCY General Assembly.
- C& Y I takes up a permanent, non-elected OP pl MGCY in the UN. This OP place is no named.

Assembly

= The body that <u>coordinates the activities of the UN MGCY</u>. The Assembly happens through regular calls convened by OPs, witl invitations through the mail lists. <u>Open for all individual and organisational members of the UN MGCY with equal weightage.</u>

- Receive reports from the OPs and the WGs on their activities and any policy or statements that have been given on behalf of the
- Coordinate any policy and decide on issues where there may be overlap or conflict between WG.
 Ratify changes to the individuals representing each organisation as OPs, DOPs or Facilitators by a simple majority.

Internal Working Group (IWG)

- Communications and Media: maintaining our websites, external presence, and media
- Renewal and Outreach: improving internal processes and increasing the accessibility of MGCY's work to new/potential members.
- Elections: coordinating the elections and selections of the MGCY.
- . Finance: coordinating the finance of the MGCY and advise on fundraising

- · Each IWG is co-ordinated by facilitators, open for any eligible organisation or individual to apply. Elected through an election process co-ordinated by the Election / Selectio
- All MGCY members may participate in any Internal Working Group, with the exception of Elections* and Finance,** whose members are elected at the Annual Assembly.

2030 Sustainable Development Agenda

The 2030 <u>Agenda for Sustainable Development</u> was adopted in September 2015, after 3 years of negotiations and consultations. Since Rio+20, the UN MGCY has facilitated youth participation in the process of creating Agenda 2030.

Financing for Development

The Addis Ababa Action Agenda of the Third International Conference on Financing for Development was adopted in July 2015, after over a year of negotiations. This framework will guide strategies for financing, investments and means of implementation. UN MGCY has been involved since beginning of process and been a part of the Addis Coordination Group

What can YOU contribute to in this Working Group?

Small Island Development States

The Small Islands Developing States (SIDS) were first formally recognized by the international community at the UN Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED). Highlighting their challenges towards sustainable development. In 2013, the preparation process started towards the Third International Conferences on Small Islands Developing States.

Sustainable Consumption & Production

"The use of services and related products, which respond to basic needs and bring a better quality of life while minimizing the use of natural resources and toxic materials as well as the emissions of waste and pollutants over the life cycle of the service or product so as not to jeopardize the needs of further generations" The a 10-Year Framework of Programs (10YFP) on sustainable consumption and production was adopted in 2011. UN MGCY is an official stakeholders in the monitoring and review of 10YFP implementation.

Disaster Risk Reduction



The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR) was adopted in March 2015, after two years of negotiations. UN MGCY have facilitated youth throughout the process.

World Humanitarian Summit



The World Humanitarian Summit, set to take place in Istanbul on 23-24 May 2016, is a global call to action by the United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon. The Summit will re-inspire and reinvigorate a global commitment to humanity, and initiate a set of concrete actions aimed at enabling countries and communities to better prepare for and respond to crises, and be more resilient to shocks. UN MGCY is coordinating youth participation in the WHS.

Housing and Sustainable Urbanisation

Habitat III will result in the New Urban Agenda. The negotiations started year 2014 and it will culminate in Third United Nations Conference on Housing and Sustainable Urban Development, Quite (Ecuador) in October 2016. High Level Political Forum

The High-level Political Forum on sustainable development is the main United Nations platform managing sustainable development. It provides <u>political leadership and guidance</u>; <u>follows up and review progress in implementing</u> <u>sustainable development</u> commitments and addresses new and emerging sustainable development challenges; enhances the integration of economic, social and environmental dimensions of sustainable development. The High-level Political Forum meets: Every four years at the level of Heads of State and Government under the auspices of the General Assembly (GA), and every year under the auspices of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). <u>Next meeting is in July 2016, New York (USA)</u>.

What can YOU contribute to in this Working Group?

Monitoring of International Frameworks

Make shadow reporting of your government of the implementation of one of the goals and indicators of any of the Post-2015 Frameworks reporting to HLPF (Agenda 2030, SFDRR, FfD, SIDS, SCP).


What is Science Policy Interface?
